Salary During your Studies

- Minijobs / low qualified jobs:
 - Often minimum wage „Mindestlohn“: 13,90 € gross per hour, the better and higher your qualifications, the higher the salary

- Student assistant at KIT (HiWi/WiMi):
 - Studentische Hilfskraft (during Bachelor): 15,20 € - 16,09 € gross per hour
 - Wissenschaftliche Hilfskraft (with Bachelor / Master): 16,09 – 21,42 € / gross per hour

Salary During your Studies

- Student assistant in industry:
 - Often (a bit) higher than at KIT, usually fixed
- Internships:
 - More than three months: minum wage from day one
 - Mandatory internships: no minum wage
 - Less than three months: no minimum wage
 - average 1000 € / gross per month: [Mindestlohn und Praktikum - BMAS](#)

2. Collective Agreement

- Watch in job offers for: „salary according to collective agreement (Tarifvertrag), „based on TVöD / IG Metall“, see TVÖD-L [Entgelttabelle TV-L 2026](#)

Salary - Reductions

- **Mini-jobs:** generally exempt from taxes and social security contributions. You pay a small contribution to the pension plan (but you can be released from that)
- **Hiwi / student assistant-jobs:** the social security contributions depend on how much you earn and whether you have other jobs. Students benefit from reduced social security contributions.
- **Regular jobs after studies:** charged with taxes and social security, for orientation see here [gross net tax calculator germany 2025 german wage tax calculator 2025](https://www.informatik.kit.edu/english/10509.php)

Benefits of Hands-on Activities during Studies?

- Job market changed within the last years in computer science
- Especially junior positions in software development are harder to find due to AI
- Administration jobs are still available
- A degree is not a guarantee, additional practical experience counts more than ever

What Kind of Job and Branch is Better?

- That one, that suits your future career goals and your available time best
- If you want to work in academia after studies, go for HiWi Jobs / internships, BUT: HiWi Jobs at KIT are often in English, so it can be a good stepping stone for a first job
- Internship vs. student assistant in industry: no general advice, depending on your situation and time

Legal Aspects for International Students



Legal Aspects

- Let the employer know in your CV and motivational letter how many days and hours you are allowed to work – see your “Aufenthaltserlaubnis and then “Beiblatt” for details
 - this will help to avoid misunderstandings
 - prevent your application from being rejected due to uncertainty

“Are you a refugee or migrant from outside the EU living in Baden-Württemberg? Are you currently working or about to start a job? If so, we can provide you with free advice on your rights.

We'll help you solve your problems and answer questions about:

- Employment contracts (e.g., mini-jobs, part-time or full-time work)
- Wages and salaries (e.g., unpaid work hours)
- Working hours, vacation, termination
- Insurance, e.g., for illness and workplace accidents
- Short-time work benefits
- Job Center, Social Services, Employment Agency”

FAQ – Ausländerbehörde (Immigration Office)

Can I hold down multiple jobs while studying?

- Yes, the only limit is the cap of 140 full workdays or 240 half workdays.

Does a thesis written at a company count toward the limit?

- In general, you should submit a request to the Office of Immigration to have your thesis approved, so that, if approved, a corresponding note can be added to the supplementary sheet.

Residence permit for job seeking after graduation § 20(1) of the Residence Act:

When should international students update their visa status? On the date of withdrawal from the university or on the date of their final exam?

- To switch from a residence permit for the purpose of study to one for the purpose of job seeking or employment, you must provide proof of having successfully completed your studies. You may submit a diploma, a certificate of academic title, or a certificate of withdrawal from the university. Once one of these documents has been submitted, the Foreigners' Registration Office can make a decision on the application.

Language Skills



Language Skills

- The better your German skills, the wider range of jobs you can apply for
- Most companies ask for a **B2 / C1 level** of German for entry-level jobs after graduation
- The rule for applications is that
 - if the advertisement is in English, you should apply in English
 - if the advertisement is in German, apply in German and confirm that you can participate in the interview in German. If not, apply in English and state that you are in the process of learning German.

Language Skills

- If you're considering staying in Germany after graduation, take every opportunity to learn and improve your German, as well as gain professional experience – start now!
 - One possible approach is to start with student jobs in English and then switch to German as soon as possible

- If you are holding a language certificate, add the level in your CV and add it to your application
- If you are not holding a language certificate, see self assessment for different levels: [Common European Framework of Reference for Languages - DAAD](#)

Application Standards in Germany



General Aspects

- Apply at least 3 to 4 months before you want to start working
- Required documents in Germany:
 - Cover letter (mostly, read job offer)
 - CV
 - Certificates (attachment)

- Clear layout and structure & consistent formatting
- Separation in sections with informative headings
- Reverse chronological order
- Description of tasks and responsibilities using key words (bullet points)
- Length: 1-2 pages...most templates on Canva are limited suitable to the German job market and the one from Europass is too detailed → **I have a better template for you!**
- Optional: Photo (no visa photo or selfie!)

CV for Computer Science

- Add github if you want to
- State internal internships as practical experience
- Focus on your technical skills
- Add private of projects in your studies
- Have a clear profile, who you are!

ATS – Applicant Tracking System

- One core component of ATS is a CV parser → software that automatically analyzes and extracts information from CVs
- What happens to your application after you click submit:
 - 1. Parsing:** ATS reads your document and extracts structured data: name, contact details, job titles, employers, dates, education, and skills.
 - 2. Keyword Matching:** Your extracted content is compared against the job posting. The ATS looks for exact terms or close variants — e.g. 'project management', 'Python', 'budget responsibility'

ATS – Applicant Tracking System

- What happens to your application after you click submit:
 - 3. Scoring / Ranking:** Each application receives a relevance score (often 0–100). The more your profile matches the job description, the higher your rank.
 - 4. Filtering:** Applications below the score threshold are automatically rejected — often with a standard 'We will keep your CV on file' email.
 - 5. Shortlist to Recruiter:** Only top-ranked applications land on the recruiter's desk, usually as a sorted list rather than a pile of individual documents.

ATS - friendly CV

- Use standard headings and date formats (MM.YYYY)
- Use relevant keywords. As a general rule, every resume should be tailored to the specific job and company.
- Avoid special characters and abbreviations
- No tables or graphics (at least none that are important)

ATS - friendly CV

- Clear, simple design
- Common, easily readable fonts (Calibri, Times New Roman, Arial) – no special fonts. No more than two columns.
- Avoid spelling mistakes
- Test with an ATS scanner or text editor

Cover Letter

Write an individual cover letter to each position!

- a cover letter is not a repetition of your CV but goes further:
 - what did you learn so far
 - where are you an expert
 - what is your professional passion
 - where do you want to contribute to
 - how does this job help you on your professional way
 - why do you want to work for this company and so on

Cover Letter

Why are you the right person for the job?

- Analyze the required qualifications and skills specified in the job ad
- Show that and why you have the subject-related qualifications & personal skills
- Give specific examples from former experiences (no generic sentences!)
- Use keywords (see job ad)
- For international students: let the employer know about your future plans→do you want to stay in Germany?

Cover Letter

You can structure your cover letter aligned to the individual job offer:

1. Paragraph: I fulfill the requirements / qualifications
2. Paragraph: I can do the tasks or I have an idea how to do them
3. Paragraph: I am motivated for this company / project / job

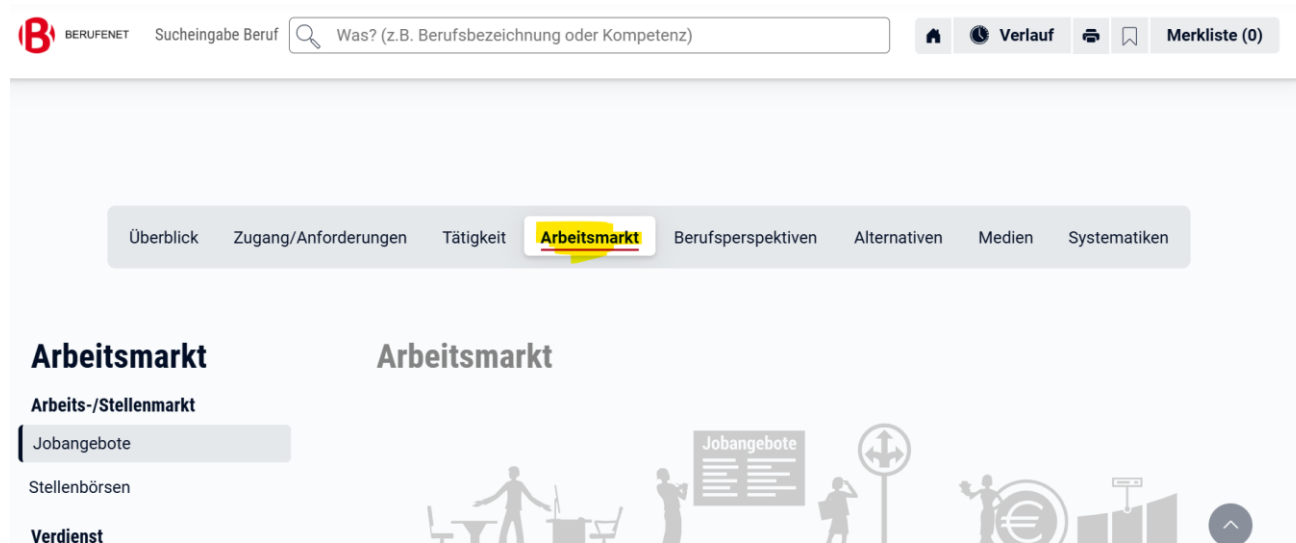

Networking and Hidden Job Market



What is the hidden job market?

- job opportunities that are not publicly advertised
- these positions are often filled through personal connections, referrals, or internal company networks
- In Germany, it's estimated that: **Up to 60–70%** of jobs are never posted online
- Typical entry points:
 - Referrals by employees or former interns
 - Direct applications to companies (speculative applications)
 - University connections (professors, research groups)
 - Career fairs, events, LinkedIn, informal conversations

Practical networking opportunities for students

Tool	Tips
LinkedIn/Xing	Keep your profile updated, connect with others, send polite messages
Career fairs and career events	Come prepared, ask specific questions, follow up afterwards
Alumni	Reach out to former students: “How did you find your internship?”
University events / career service events	Attend talks, research group meetings, institute gatherings – start small talk
Professors & student jobs	HiWi or research assistant jobs often lead to internships via recommendations or vice versa

Two really usefull hacks for LinkedIn

Optimize your profile with GPT

- Download your LinkedIn Profile as pdf
- Ask ChatGPT to check your profile and to suggest you optimizations. Tell ChatGPT that you uploaded your profile as a pdf. Promt, what you want to to in LinkedIn (networking, finding a student assistant job...)
- Proof everything ChatGPT suggests and find your own words

Prospects after graduation

If you are from a third country, you have the possibility of obtaining a residence permit valid for up to 18 months to look for a job. During these 18 months, you are allowed to take up **any type** of job. Please note that this type of residence permit is **not renewable**. The following requirements must be met in order to obtain a residence permit for 18 months:

- Proof of successfully completed studies
- Proof of health insurance cover
- Proof of being able to secure your livelihood

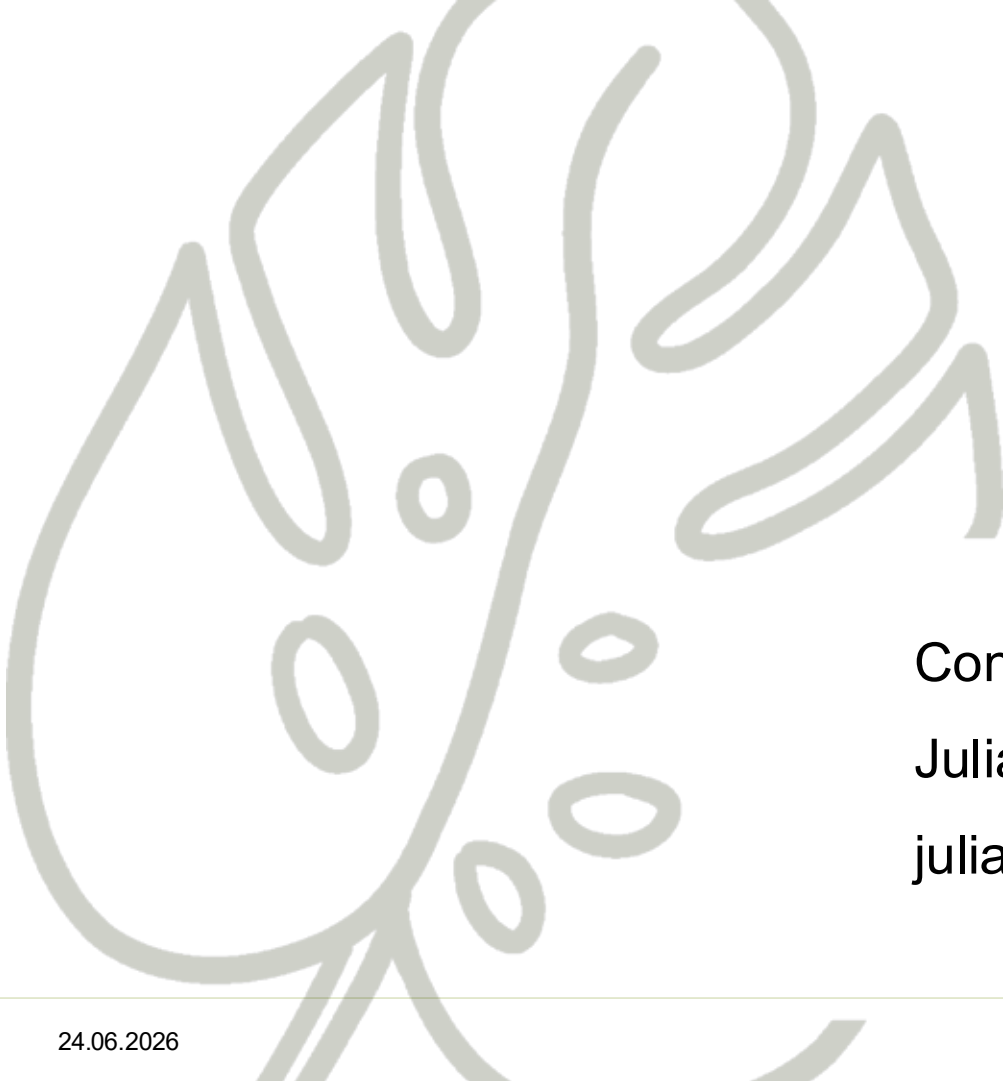
